VET is taken as part of the Western Australian Certificate of Education (WACE) and completion by the student provides a wide range of post school options and pathways.

Our Year 11 and Year 12 students in Langford Islamic College have the opportunity to complete either a BSB20115 Certificate II in Business VET or CHC22015 Certificate II in Community Services course over a year.

Our students have access to a laptop each in the VET classroom and work collaboratively in role play scenarios for their assessments. They also enjoy work placement around the school while performing routine workplace tasks that are required for various units they are completing in this course.

Firstly, we have
always promoted
good health and
hygiene practices in
class. We discussed
hand washing
procedures, cough
and sneeze
etiquette and the
use of hand
sanitisers.

We have been encouraging our students to be responsible for their belongings throughout the school day. We also like you to encourage your child's independence, regarding home readers and homework.

Please ensure your child brings his/her home reading books and library books back to class to change. It is important to read aloud every night and taking the opportunity to discuss what has been read as this will support the love for reading with your child.

In the first term we ensured that all students were settled in class. We established positive relationships with all students by getting to know them better.

Learning in Term 1

In Mathematics, for Number and Algebra we started looking at the concept of counting which includes building the confidence to sequence numbers, counting forwards, backwards and skip count to 100. This lead into exploring the importance of Place Value where the students recognised, modelled, read and ordered numbers.

In Measurement and Geometry, the focus was on 2D and 3D shapes. In Statistics and Probability, we described the chance of something happening using words like 'unlikely, impossible, likely, and will and will not happen.' We identified place value by bundling popsticks to show tens and ones.

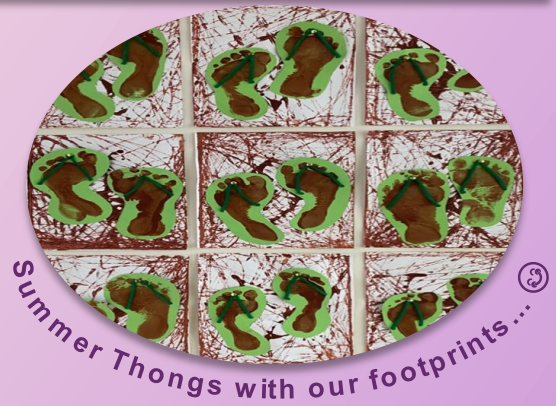
In Science, we learnt about living things in their environment and students learnt to investigate by observing, exploring, posing and answering questions. They learnt to observe by looking for characteristics and made predictions about living and non-living.

In History we looked at different family structures, family trees, roles and the lives of family past and present.

In Art, students were very enthusiastic in drawing their self-portraits and printing their hands and feet. We have started on our Ramadan crafts to display for the coming Ramadan.

For Harmony Day children came in their lovely traditional costumes and we had class activities to celebrate and talked about Harmony Day.

Finally, we hope everyone will stay safe and maintain good health and hygiene practices in their daily lives.



We began the term talking about me and activities promoting self-esteem, getting along with others and making new friends in a harmonious environment. There was a lot of learning taking place in the classroom and here are some of the learning that took place in class.

In writing, our students shared writing pieces about their holiday experiences, weekend recounts and about them and their families. We looked at the features of a recount using a '5 Finger Plan' which included: Who? What? Where? When? and Why? To make our writing more interesting we used adjectives for describing the people involved and settings.
