

## The following outlines some of our learning in Term 2:

This term under Literacy, students will be learning how to construct narrative and look at character descriptions. They will become familiar with the use of adjectives and noun groups. We will be reading a wide range of narrative texts and writing descriptions about the different characters. We will also focus on basic punctuation such as capital letters and full stops in our writing. In reading, the focus is to ensure that children read for meaning and to gather information.

For home reading, it is important that parents sign the reading log as it helps us know where your child is at with their reading at home. We are also cultivating the love for reading so please encourage them to read every night.

For Creative Arts, we are focusing on Visual Arts and Drama. Children will create an array of artwork allowing them to develop fine motor skills and to experiment with a variety of media. Drama will focus on a story read in class about a Rainbow Fish and how to show kindness to others.

In our Mathematics Learning Area, we continue to work on consolidation of Numbers through concepts such as counting, place value and addition. We will begin exploring the different addition strategies and will continue to develop these concepts throughout the term. Students will be introduced to a wide range of problem solving strategies, including drawing pictures or diagrams and using materials, counters, number lines and hundred charts. Students will learn through mathematical investigations, working both inde-

pendently and in groups.

For History, students will learn about similarities and differences by comparing the past with the present and how technology has changed.

In Geography, students will continue to describe features of places and mapping skills. Some of the natural features in a place are explained in our Aboriginal dream stories read in class.

In Science, we are looking at everyday materials that can be changed in a variety of ways and exploring how they change.

An excursion for the Year 1 will be coming up this term as well so it is definitely going to be an exciting term with lots of learning and fun.

#### Sculpture by the Sea

Year 8 Students attended the 'Sculpture by the Sea' exhibition in Cottesloe on the 16<sup>th</sup> March 2017. This was a great opportunity for students to integrate with the local community and develop an understanding of how elements and principles of design are embedded into the production of Sculptural form. Students enjoyed the variety of materiality in which they were able to explore art works created for location by local, state, national and international Artists. Students considered the process of construction and the innovation of a variety of surfaces. In the early afternoon, students attended another exhibition at the Kidogo Art House

in Fremantle and the creative artist studios where a guest artist gave a talk about her professional photography practice. This term the students will work on a sculpture project with the Artist-in-Residence Sculptor, Mr Jon Denaro whom has exhibited over the past 10 years at the 'Sculpture by the Sea' exhibition.

In History, students learnt about "Our Heritage" - Old & New. To experience this, students did an art activity about how clocks looked in the past.





#### **SESSION OVERVIEW**


- An overview of the digital world including current Australian statistics and trends, apps commonly used by children and young people and relevant age restrictions.
