




CID CARD DESIGN 2018



Arabic is considered an emerging language of global importance. Arabic is also one of the six official languages of the United Nations. To work towards addressing this challenge, the Arabic Language Teachers' Association of Western Australia (ALTAWA) was born. I remember how my family was worried that I would lose my Arabic language skill on my return to Australia. However, the direct opposite occurred when I discovered that

I would be studying at Langford Islamic College and I would be in the advance Arabic class. In conclusion, my experience in Egypt has been a fascinating one and I will never ever forget it.


